



PAN AMERICAN WATERSKI SCORER – INTERNATIONAL LEVEL ONE REQUIREMENTS, QUALIFICATIONS & RENEWALS

as of February 17, 2022

- I. Requirements to become a Pan American (Level 1 International) Scorer
 - A. 18 years of age or older
 - B. Have no less than 3 years of experience in tournaments as an official or athlete
 - C. Requires Federation Approval from appropriate Federation Committee
 - D. Must hold a Level 2 Scoring Credential, and have at least 1 year of Level 2 Scoring Experience. If the Official's Country does not provide Level 2 Scoring Credentials, then the Official may receive approval from the Pan Am Council to test for Level 1.

- II. Testing Protocol for Pan American Scorer
 - A. Exam is online only.
 - B. The Exam is "open book".
 - C. The exam committee will confirm eligibility of potential candidates.
 - D. The exam committee will administer, oversee, and grade the test.
 - E. Results will be reported to the examinee, the Pan Am TC, and the country from which the examinee was promoted.
 - F. Exam Score Requirements
 1. Written Exam Score must equal or exceed 80%
 2. Practical Slalom, Trick and Jump Score is Pass Fail
 3. Practical Exam
 - (a) Set up – Start to Finish a World Title Event on the EAME Program.

- (b) Utilizing a "Test Tournament", which the examinee will then forward to the Pan Am Scoring Committee for Evaluation.
- (c) Use 5 Countries (ex-France, Canada, US, Chile, Australia)
- (d) Use 6 Athletes for each country.
- (e) Score each Athlete in three events (made ups scores, random)
- (f) Score each Athlete who makes the finals.
- (g) Set Prelim seeding order based on current dynamic ranking list.
- (h) Set Finals Seeding based on Prelim Round Results
- (i) Run reports: Results of Prelim, Start List for Finals, OA Team, OA Individual
- (j) Send your scorebook and pdf reports to the test administrator.

G. Failure to Pass Exam

- 1. If a scorer does not pass the Pan Am Test, or any portions of the test, on attempt #1, they must wait 1 month before testing again.
- 2. If a scorer does not pass the Pan Am Test, or any portions of the test, on attempt #2, they must wait 6 months before testing again.
- 3. If a scorer does not pass the Pan Am Test, or any portions of the test, on attempt #3, they must wait 12 months before testing again.
- 4. An examinee need only re-take the portions not previously passed during testing and re-testing.

III. Maintenance Requirements, to maintain validity as a Pan Am Judge and qualify to sit for Renewal Testing.

- A. Participating in at least 2 tournaments every 2 years (5 tournaments every 5 years). For Pan Am Three Event Scorers, these events must be three event tournaments.
- B. Re-testing is Not Required If the official scores once every 2 years at a World Championships, Pan Am Championships, 2-Latin-American Championships, - 2 R/L Championship Type Events, or 2 Pro Events.

IV. Renewal Terms and Requirements

- A. Official must be in good standing with their Federation.
- B. Official must have maintained their validity as a Pan Am Scorer by following all requirements.
- C. Re-test must be done every 5 years. With Score & Testing requirements as outlined as above.
